Sustainable Cities: Ecological Economic and Environmental Psychological Aspects of Urban Design and Management

The goal of the workshop is to form interdisciplinary partnerships, start new research and practical projects, as well as create and support networks among scientists and practitioners from the European Union and other countries.

- 6) City Limits: Material Flows and Ecological Footprint Analysis of a Large City.

The workshop will consist of expert presentations, round table discussions and the examination of case studies, as well as field trips in London in which the environmental problems of this city will be examined.
